A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF COCONUT CREEK, FLORIDA, IN SUPPORT OF THE CITY'S REQUEST FOR COMMUNITY PROJECT FUNDING TO COMPLETE THE LYONS ROAD PEDESTRIAN SAFETY LIGHTING PROJECT; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the City of Coconut Creek ("City") supports enhancing existing multimodal infrastructure, and enhancing pedestrian lighting and safety; and

WHEREAS, the Lyons Road Pedestrian Safety Lighting Project is the final piece of a multi-agency collaboration that provides for regional connectivity and transportation options that are not car centric; and

WHEREAS, the City enhanced the project by including conduit for the future installation of pedestrian safety lighting during the construction of the other multi-modal components of the project; and

WHEREAS, the City intends to request support and advocacy from Congressman Ted Deutch for Community Project Funding to complete the Lyons Road Pedestrian Lighting and Safety Project; and

WHEREAS, a resolution of support from the City of Coconut Creek's Commission for the project is encouraged as part of the Community Project Funding application; and

WHEREAS, this project is included in the long-range transportation plan of the Metropolitan Planning Organization; and

WHEREAS, the proposed project will continue the City's strategic efforts outlined in Vision 2030 towards adaptable and progressive mobility, safety and quality of life, and sustainable environment.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF COCONUT CREEK, FLORIDA:

Section 1: That the foregoing "WHEREAS" clauses are hereby ratified and confirmed as being true and correct and are hereby made a specific part of this resolution.

<u>Section 2:</u> That the City Commission hereby supports the Community Project Funding request for the Lyons Road Pedestrian Safety Lighting project and commits to fund the perpetual maintenance associated with the lighting.

<u>Section 3:</u> That if any clause, section, other part or application of this resolution is held by any court of competent jurisdiction to be unconstitutional or invalid, in part or in application, it shall not affect the validity of the remaining portion or applications of this resolution.

Section 4: That this resolution shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its adoption.
