Qualifications and Experience

• Ability to Perform the Scope of Services Proposed

As you will see from our client list provided in the enclosed forms, Van Scoyoc Associates currently represents 27 municipal clients. There are many important principals that set us apart from other Washington-based firms and have allowed us to build such a successful practice in representing municipal clients and other public entities:

Nothing better exemplifies the ability of Van Scoyoc Associates to flex than during the current COVID Pandemic. Throughout the past 10 months, the entire firm has rallied together to support our clients by providing a steady stream of information about Federal funding, requirements, and other resources that have been made available to communities. We have become a trusted source of information for the senior leadership of communities that have had to make difficult decisions in the midst of these unprecedented times, and we have helped identify newly created funding sources to support the evolving needs of these communities.

We have been able to respond to the pandemic while at the same time supporting the regular Federal agendas of the communities we represent. This was evident in December when Congress simultaneously worked to complete its regular funding bills for the year, negotiate a COVID-relief package, wrap up other major end-of-year legislation, and plan for the transition into a new Congress and a new Administration. Our Van Scoyoc Associates' team did not miss a step and will continue to advocate for our client needs into the new 117th Congress.

As outlined in your Scope of Services, the VSA team will actively represent and advocate for the City's interests before Congress and Federal agencies. We will coordinate with the City on key developments in Congress and within the Administration and provide an analysis on how these developments may positively or negatively impact the City. Our team's approach to providing the services outlined in your solicitation will include the robust representation of the City's interests, professional advice, timely reports, monitoring services, attending key hearings and events, and other support activities. A further breakdown of our proposed activities and experience as referenced in the "Scope of Services" listed in the RFP are as follows and represent the components of our overall Operational Workplan:

2.1 Coordinate funding, legislation, and policies within the United States Congress and Federal Agencies.

The VSA team will maintain direct and frequent contact with your key Senators (Rubio and Scott) and Congressman Deutch to keep them informed about the City's priority projects, funding needs, and specific effects from Federal policy decisions. This includes coordinating a strategy for policy and budgetary needs in federal funding bills and other legislation before the Congress and Federal agencies.

As a former Chief of Staff to Florida Congressman Bill Young, Harry Glenn maintains a close working relationship with the House and Senate Appropriations Committees and all the members of the Florida delegation. He already has spent considerable time getting to know the five new Florida



members of the delegation that were sworn into Congress on January 3rd. Harry has found that the delegation, with its varied committee assignments, has always worked closely together to advance the interests of the state and individual cities and counties within the state.

The most effective Federal strategies are the ones that take into consideration both Congressional oversight and Federal agency program policies and requirements. Your team leader, Jim Crum, spent 23 years working within the Executive Branch and Federal agency policy environment. Working together, Jim and Harry will be able to develop positions and approaches that are complementary between the Congress and Federal agencies which can be supported within the legal and policy parameters of both branches of government.

The activities described above have already started – the new Congress has been sworn in, the Administration is already establishing policies, and the appropriations year has begun. We are already engaged with all of these activities and will provided a clear upcoming schedule of anticipated decision events as the year unfolds.

2.2 Advocate the City's interests during the United States legislative and regulatory process. In addition to remaining close to the Florida Congressional delegation, the team will work with the Senate and House leadership, and senior committee staff members to provide you with strong bipartisan access and a team that will proactively advocate in the Congress on your behalf. We will help you determine the City's position with regard to important legislation and convey your positions to the members of your delegation and the appropriate oversight Committees during the during the times they are seeking outside input.

Another VSA strength is our understanding of the Executive Branch and our ability to access Federal agencies and their program decision makers. As an example, in recent years we have coordinated with program leaders in the Department of Justice on ADA compliance issues, EPA on landfill emission standards, HUD on support animals housing policy, NOAA on offshore drilling, Department of Transportation on infrastructure investments, Corps of Engineers on "Waters of the United States (WOTUS)" policy, and many other agency programs that could affect the City.

We expect new "rulemaking" by the agencies to start surfacing in the first quarter of the year as new political appointees and agency decisions makers take on their new jobs. We will continue regular communication with senior Administration policymakers and regulators and will recommend how and when to best position yourself on policy, budgetary, and regulatory initiatives. Monitoring regulatory activity is



critical for municipal agencies, especially with a new Administration and its new priorities. As with legislation, we will advise the City on regulatory issues and help the City develop positions on those regulations and draft comments in support or opposition to those of greatest concern.

VSA is committed to relentlessly working to create new strategic opportunities for the City and has extensive experience working to help develop innovative approaches. As outlined earlier in this proposal, we also work with the appropriations and authorizing committees in the House and Senate to try and create and expand funding opportunities with Federal agencies and departments for our municipal clients.

2.3 Monitor and report on proposed and ongoing legislation that could affect the City.

Another of our important responsibilities will be to identify and track key pieces of legislation related to issues in your annual Federal Legislative Agenda when they arise and advising the City in a timely manner on options for responding. Often this is by drafting letters, testimony, or statements to Federal leaders, responses to Federal legislation and regulations on items of concern and generating Congressional letters of support for applications for Federal funding. VSA will keep track of deadlines and so your staff has plenty of time to review all legislative bills and support materials and work with us to develop City positions. This will establish a legislative record of the City's interest and advocacy on key Federal issues.

2.4 Identify, analyze and report political and/or policy trends that may affect the development of legislation that may impact the City.

2020 was an extremely significant year as a result of the COVID pandemic. Political priorities in the response to the pandemic and how it affected the City varied greatly between the Administration and the Congress. VSA responded by establishing a matrix team to evaluate every action and policy from each federal agency and Congress while providing bi-weekly reporting during the pandemic such that the City was aware of the evolving policies and relief bills being developed throughout the year. Similarly, in 2021 we are maintaining this effort with a focus on the new set of priorities being established by a new Administration and Congress. One of these key priorities is removing the restrictions on FEMA public assistance that were put in place by the prior Administration. Another priority for us will be advocating for and tracking future State and Local relief assistance that has been debated in previous COVID relief bills. At the time of this proposal, Congress is developing their next COVID relief

legislative package and we expect the additional funding for State and local governments will continue to be a key issue.

2.5 Assist in the formulation of public policy related to public works, transportation, solid waste and recycling, communications, public safety, physical environment, water resources, and housing programs.

The new Biden Administration and leadership of the 117th Congress have set as a priority the development of a comprehensive infrastructure bill during the first half of 2021. Your team has extensive experience in Federal public works and infrastructure policy and funding. Jim Crum and Harry Glenn will use their agency contacts and Congressional relationships to advocate for the public infrastructure needs of the City in terms of agency eligibility as well as infrastructure related appropriations. We expect the infrastructure bill will establish public policy and funding for public works, transportation, public safety, water resources and other related project opportunities for the City. While we also expect this legislation to offer delegated funding through the States, there will be a high likelihood that it will also establish policy to expand current Federal infrastructure programs increasing the success rates for grant pursuits and agency program eligibility.

VSA has spent recent years advocating for project opportunities in the categories listed in this section for the City. In 2021, we plan on developing a specific "infrastructure bill strategy" for the City advocating for legislative policies and priorities for infrastructure investment and taking advantage of the anticipated areas of increased funding opportunities. We will work closely with your public works and economic development departments in formulating this approach and ensuring it aligns well with your investment priorities.

2.6 Monitor solid waste issues and changes in law that could impact the operation of the Monarch Hill Landfill. This includes but is not limited to contacting the Department of Environmental Protection, the Congress, and various Federal agencies including the Department of Justice and the City's Congressional delegation.

Your VSA team has been tracking Federal regulations related to the Monarch Hill Landfill for the past 9 years. We have briefed Senators Scott and Rubio as well as Congressman Deutch on the City's concerns around the impacts from the landfill and in particular to EPA's proposed regulations that could affect the landfill operations.

We reported in 2016, that EPA finalized a proposed rule by calling for a reduction in the threshold at which a landfill must install emissions control systems from 50 mega grams (Mg) per year to 34 Mg per year. Any landfill that exceeds those thresholds would be required to install and utilize a gas collection and control system to bring emissions levels below the threshold within 30 months of the violation. VSA helped draft additional comments for the City to submit in support of this rule. The rule was finalized and became effective on October 28, 2016.

Under the Trump Administration, the EPA announced that they were reconsidering several issues in the 2016 rule and enacted a 90-day stay on the 2016 NPS rule and eventually, in 2020, had EPA take a position that the 2016 rule was not financially feasible to implement. During this time, we develop letters of support to implement the rule and attended an EPA Public Hearing related to the public comments on EPA's reevaluation of the rule. We clearly understand that this issue is one of the top priorities for the City and as such we will advocate strongly for the new emission standards to be fully implemented. We also expect that the Biden Administration will review the 2016 regulation for implementation, and we stand poised to continue our coordination with EPA and your delegation to support the stricter emission standards.

2.7 Develop strategies to obtain and maximize funding for City programs including but not limited to fire and emergency services, reclaimed water projects, and transportation and roadway improvements. This includes the identification of and pursuit of Federal grants.

It is important that your Federal lobbyist has the ability to not only identify and provide a capture strategy for Federal program funding that you may qualify for but also the ability to identify and analyze competitive grant opportunities during the multiple grant cycles that unfold each year. VSA tracks the budget and appropriations process throughout the year that in turn set the grant application windows, policies, scoring criteria, and consequently the feasibility for the City to win a given grant.

This comprehensive pre-analysis helps drive our recommendations and guidance for you as our client. Once a grant is identified that we feel you would be competitive for, we will then create a "capture strategy" that summarizes the lengthy grant announcement and highlights the key steps to preparing, reviewing, and strengthening your application. When appropriate, we will seek to engage with the Federal agency who released the grant announcement and inform them of your intentions and possibly schedule a meeting for advisement by the agency's grant administrator. This provides recognition and anticipation of your grant application by the agency which greatly enhances your prospects of winning the grant award.

2.8 Prepare correspondence on the City's behalf in support of specific lobbying objectives.

A key role for us in supporting your Federal Agenda is to develop letters, summary documents, white papers, and other documents that clarify your positions on key issues. Over the years, we have demonstrated the ability to draft Congressional letters on your behalf on fast moving legislation to influence the positions of your delegation and express important feedback on impacts at the local municipal level and in particular to the City of Coconut Creek.

In working with Congressman Deutch, we have shared and briefed his staff on your Federal Agenda and used this as a basis for additional correspondence throughout the year specifically citing proposed agency rulings, Hill legislation, hearing testimony and/or questions, and potential White House policy.

Over the past three years, we have helped draft and share City positions in correspondence to the Administration and the Congress on subjects of waste recycling, COVID FEMA funding eligibility, grant support letters from your delegation, support to the Thin Blue Line Act, gun control policy, and appropriations requests for report language recognizing the need to evaluate health effects from wireless infrastructure. We understand the importance of making your voice heard and being establishing you as a municipal thought leader – we will continue to support your positions in Congress and the Federal agencies.

2.9 Maintain direct and frequent contact with key United States Senators and Congressmen. Upon request, coordinate appointments/meetings between City Administration /Staff and appropriate Federal legislators.

As Capitol Hill and the Federal agencies continue to reopen to the public, VSA will work with the City to meet with your Congressional delegation and brief them on your Federal Legislative Agenda. Given the expanded use of virtual meetings, we will also recommend opportunities for you to also participate and express the City's opinions on key issues. This will include planning and preparing key meetings with your delegation and Federal agency leadership. The goal is to schedule impactful meetings that raise your visibility and advance your Federal agenda. VSA will also continuously meet with Federal

policymakers on your behalf to keep your agenda on track and provide follow-up validation of your positions.

To supplement meetings in Washington, VSA will work to schedule timely meetings with members of the Congressional delegation and Federal agency officials when they are in Coconut Creek to provide opportunities for the City's leadership to interact with Federal leaders when they are in Florida or nearby.

VSA, and in particular Harry Glenn, is also experienced at working with Florida agencies that may be partnering with the City on projects. Harry has worked with the State DOT, Enterprise Florida, and the Florida Defense Support Task Force, among others. This is particularly helpful in syncing up state and Federal funding for key projects. The Florida and the Federal fiscal years start on different dates, and the sessions of Congress and the State Legislature do not always align, so this coordination is important in determining where to seek funds first.

The VSA team also has experience with building coalitions to support client initiatives. This includes working with associations such as the National League of Cities, U.S. Conference of Mayors, National Association of Counties and related organizations at the state level. This has proven to be especially effective in advocating for COVID-related funding and policies. The team also has experience at working with business interests and community groups in support of projects. These efforts amplify the need and support for important initiatives. VSA has coordinated business support for various transportation related projects, for port development projects, and for economic development projects.

2.10 Appear and testify before Federal hearings, rule-making proceedings and other administrative agency or legislative meetings when necessary to promote and seek passage of legislation affecting the City of Coconut Creek and its citizens.

We realize that we are your eyes and ears in Washington DC. In the past, this has involved attending hearings, rule-making proceedings, and other policy making agency meetings that could affect the City's operations and Federal agenda priorities. As an example, in 2019 VSA attended the EPA hearing on implementing 2016 landfill emission standards and collaborated viewpoints with the National Resources Defense Council. Another example involved attending a Senate oversight hearing that had the FCC Chairman testifying. The issue on potential health effects from 5G was addressed and helped shape a response letter to FCC on their proposed rulemaking on 5G implementation released later that year. The hearing testimony also helped the advocacy strategy we developed for the City in support to the Congresswoman Eshoo bill that tried to restore local oversight on 5G implementation. We will continue to serve this presence for you by participating in events that shape Federal policy related to your priorities.

2.11 Draft an annual Federal Legislative Agenda to be completed and sent to the City by January 15 of each year after significant discussion with staff.

VSA has direct experience in collaboratively developing a Federal Legislative Agenda each year for the City. We plan to continue this practice as it has served as a helpful basis for strategies as each Congressional year unfolds. The success of the Agenda depends on a clear summary of issues and then a deeper analysis on the history of each issue and anticipated strategy in the upcoming year. We also realize that it is a living document and maintaining an agile and realistic approach to each issue is important to pivot towards opportunities throughout the year.

- 2.12 Report regularly to the City by way of correspondence, information bulletins, and personal briefings concerning specific Federal legislation, rules, policy, and program directions..
- 2.13 Provide a monthly report of activities.
- 2.14 Provide documentation and research materials upon request.
- 2.15 Provide at least one trip to a City Commission Meeting to give an update to the City on matters concerning the City.

We insist on being accountable and responsive to our clients. This starts with regular communication with the Mayor, Commission members, and staff as appropriate through regular phone calls, written reports, special analytical papers about emerging issues, and presenting our year-end summary in January to the City Commission. 

Successful funding and legislative initiatives for our public client entities

As you requested, the following is information about accomplishments that have been completed by VSA for its municipal clients. While the specific projects are complete, the engagement with the clients continues in most cases as we continue to support other projects. These examples are illustrative in nature and is not meant to be a complete list of all VSA successes.

Experience with Federal funding -- The members of the VSA team for Coconut Creek, and the firm in general, have deep experience at helping to deliver Federal funding for municipal clients. This includes funding generated through annual appropriations and legislative bills, the allocation of funds by agencies, and through the careful positioning of clients to successfully compete for Federal funding opportunities.

As a result of the 2010 moratorium on earmarked Congressional spending, firms such as VSA have had to develop new strategies for Federal funding of important projects. The VSA team is adept at



positioning clients to secure Federal funding from a wide range of agencies and is one reason that the number of municipal clients we represent has grown over these past 10 years.

Earlier in the proposal, we highlight the possibility that Congress could reinstitute the process known as Congressional earmarked spending for community projects. This could significantly benefit the City as two of your major Federal representatives – Senator Marco Rubio is a member of the Senate Appropriations Committee. Your VSA team has extensive experience in working through the Congressional earmark process both during their time on Capitol Hill and while at VSA. They are closely tracking current deliberations on this subject and will be ready to step off quickly and knowledgeably to assist the City in submitting compelling spending requests.

Since 2010, Federal agencies have been given much wider latitude to award discretionary and grant funding on a competitive basis. VSA is well-positioned to help you navigate the competitive Federal grant-making process. VSA will work with the City to develop strategies to seek Federal funding. This includes work on the development of agency policies, priorities, and budgets that determine how federal funds will be spent to the movement of Congressional legislative and funding initiatives that may present important new opportunities to compete.

VSA is successful in helping public entities secure Federal funding because of the firm's experience in working with agencies to support the development of competitive and compelling grant applications. It is through working with Congressional committee staff and Federal agency leadership that VSA can glean intelligence in advance of public announcements; understand key areas of focus for each competition; develop targeted relationships with Federal decisionmakers and program managers in support of client efforts; and provide an experienced, outside critique and close reading of grant applications to make them as complete as possible. The firm also monitors Federal legislation and agency initiatives to identify new notices of funding availability that will be coming forward to allow

clients to develop programs and projects consistent with federal objectives. Additionally, as clients submit grant applications, VSA can help gather letters of support from local members of Congress. If applications are not successful, VSA can set up invaluable debriefing sessions with agencies to help grant writers understand how they can submit a more competitive applications in the future.

VSA is different from many other Washington advocacy firms as staff will not simply forward your staff grant notices from the Federal Register or agency websites. What VSA will do is work with your staff to understand your goals and grant-writing capabilities and provide relevant grant announcements along with an analysis of the opportunities and how they align with your goals. Additionally, VSA will work with the City to refine your applications to ensure that they address program criteria and any underlying goals of the relevant Federal agency.

In identifying potential Federal partnerships for City projects, we find ourselves working with Federal agencies to develop creative solutions. This can include the development of Project Cooperative Agreements and Memorandum of Understandings between Federal agencies and communities. Some examples of successful support for our clients include:

COVID relief – The 116th Congress approved four major COVID relief bills and the new Congress and Administration intends to develop another package early this year. It likely will include additional funding for state and local governments.

VSA has exceeded client expectations in assisting communities with their urgent and varied needs during the COVID pandemic. This includes providing continuous updates about legislation and Federal agency announcements related to COVID relief funding, including new programs created last December. All in all, VSA provided over 80 individual reports addressing fast moving agency policies, funding, grants, and Congressional legislation that pertained to municipal impacts from the COVID pandemic. We also found that communities sought help in appealing Federal decisions that have negatively impacted their ability to secure programmatic funding. Changing policies by FEMA and other agencies could have cost Florida communities alone millions of dollars in lost Federal funding. The VSA effort has been led by a company-wide commitment by each member of its staff to divide and track agency announcements and provide real-time information about those decisions to clients before they have been reported by the media, trade publications, and membership associations. These efforts will continue through 2021 to support our public entity clients.

Funding Successes - Funding successes for our municipal clients including our past support to Coconut Creek include advocacy to avoid cutting key programs that provide formula-based funding to the City. As an example, we strongly support Community Development Block Grant funding for the City when attempts were to reduce the funding for this important program by 20% by the President's Budget last year. As part of our effort and others, the CDBG received \$3.5 billion million in 2021 – an increase of \$100 million from 2020. We also advocated for more stable funding for FEMA hazard mitigation programs that could benefit the City. Consequently, we pushed hard to support the new FEMA Building Resilient Infrastructure and Communities (BRIC) program – a program that will provide more hazard mitigation grant funding for communities like Coconut Creek who are in hazard prone regions.

Other past project-based success examples are described below:

Our past success is the best barometer for our future success we might have in working for you.

• In 2014, the City hired Van Scoyoc Associates. Jim Crum served as the team leader and worked with the City to develop a detailed federal appropriations strategy that would create supportive Congressional policy and support by each stakeholder. These efforts included developing draft Congressional report language to highlight the merits of the project and provide guidance to the Army Corps of Engineers to prioritize reimbursements for project similar to Rio Rancho's. As a result of deploying this strategy and continued advocacy each year, the City received over \$2.1 million in federal reimbursement in 2016 and continued to received reimbursements in each year thereafter until the entire \$6.3 million balance was paid in the fall of 2018.

In 2021, VSA helped Rio Rancho pursue a new authority for water infrastructure and consequently they received an additional \$2.3 million for a water storage project.

The Mayor of Rio Rancho provided the following note to VSA:

"For five years the City of Rio Rancho did not make any significant progress obtaining millions of dollars owed to it by the federal government via a project reimbursement agreement. A consensus was reached by City leadership that a consultant with a proven track record, expertise, and know-how when it comes to navigating the federal process was necessary in order to balance the scales in the City's favor regarding this critical issue. With Van Scoyoc and Associates and Jim Crum working on the City's behalf, we saw results very quickly that would not have been possible otherwise." Mayor of Rio Rancho Greggory D. Hull

- Harry Glenn worked with the Pinellas County Board of County Commissioners to help secure \$51 million in beach construction funding from the Army Corps of Engineers the largest project of its kind in the State's history. This includes a combination of annual work plan funding provided to the Corps by Congress and emergency disaster assistance funding provided by Congress for the Corps' Flood Control and Coastal Emergencies (FCCE) account.
- Harry Glenn work with Pinellas County and its Economic Development
 Department on a successful proposal for
 \$7.5 million in funding from the
 Economic Development Administration
 to build the Tampa Bay Innovation Center
 Incubator, a 45,000 square foot state-of the-art business facility. The project, to be
 located in a designated Federal
 Opportunity Zone, is expected to create
 more than 460 jobs and spur more than
 \$66 million in private investment.



- In one of the Federal government's most highly competitive grant programs, Harry Glenn worked with Port Tampa Bay earlier this year to secure a \$19.8 million BUILD grant from the U.S. Department of Transportation to expand its shipping container operations by 60 percent. The grant allows the port to accelerate a \$55 million project to build a new 1,300-foot-long berth and a 30-acre container yard. This will enable the berth to handle more deep-draft vessels with direct rail and trucking connections.
- In 2018, Jim Crum was successful in securing \$600,000 in Federal funding to initiate a Corps of Engineers flood control study in a flood prone area for the City of Thousand Oaks. This effort was supported by congressional advocacy with their congressional representative and two U.S. Senators.



• Describe the Firm's Management Plan

Organization and management of the VSA team -- VSA will establish an organized and dedicated team while also being able to tap into the broad bench of experts throughout our firm. With this unique ability we expect being fully accountable to all of our clients. The foundation of this philosophy is being responsive to you and the ever-changing environment of Washington D.C. We have clearly identified a team leader who will be available to the City 24/7 and as such, Vice President Jim Crum will serve as your team leader and main point of contact.

He will partner with Vice President Harry Glenn and Government Relations Manager, Will Smith.



Project reporting procedures -- Communication is critical to the success of any relationship. We anticipate that we will spend a significant percentage of time communicating with your team to provide updates and respond to questions, while communicating your agenda to key Federal officials. VSA will not send broadcast emails or forward third-party documents without explaining how they impact you and recommending if and how you should respond.

VSA will prepare and submit regular <u>monthly reports</u> on relevant activities, meetings, and communications, as well as copies of bills, amendments, hearing summaries, and committee reports concerning Federal activities that affect your advocacy strategy. VSA also will send a weekly summary of activities in Washington, highlighting legislation and amendments debated, the announcement of new Federal regulations, and the **release of new discretionary grant opportunities.**

At the <u>conclusion of each session</u> of Congress, VSA will provide a comprehensive overview of the activities that took place, key legislation that was enacted, a status check of the items on the City's Federal agenda, and a look ahead to the next session.

On a timely basis, we will provide an analysis of pertinent legislation, committee reports, Federal agency regulations, and any intelligence we gather that is relevant to your Federal agenda, including up to the minute information on all legislative and budgetary issues of concern to the City. We recognize and define short- and long-term trends in funding opportunities before they become apparent and will work with your team to connect your priorities with those Federal opportunities.

This has been extremely valuable to our clients during the COVID pandemic as we have provided regular Department by Department updates about Federal actions related to the COVID. This has included a focused newsletter for municipalities to address their needs related to changing rules and regulations for CARES Act, FEMA, and other funding. For most communities, this was the only way they learned about critical information coming out from across the Federal government. We continue the publication of these newsletters today as Federal agencies are in the process of releasing a new round of COVID related funding, programs, and initiatives.

The team members you have met through this proposal take great **pride in communicating** with clients in a variety of ways to include face-to-face meetings, regularly scheduled calls and regular written material including research memos, analysis pieces, an annual report of accomplishments and other communication as needed. These reports go far beyond simply reporting the news of the day. They include information about how developing federal policy could impact the City. In some cases, those policies could create opportunities for you and in other cases they could present problems. Often VSA will recommend that you respond to these policies by outlining your support or concerns to legislators or agency leadership.

We will work with you to identify key legislative and regulatory issues and track those issues through a spreadsheet that will be available online and updated on a regular basis. We tailor these tracking documents to your individual needs and will work with you to ensure that they provide all the information you need.

Whenever requested, <u>VSA will provide in-person updates to the Mayor, Commission, and staff</u>. VSA's team commits to maintaining a visible presence with the City. We also are prepared to organize regular calls with City staff to ensure a seamless, coordinated Federal strategy. As mentioned earlier, team leader Harry Glenn is available to be in Coconut Creek whenever it is helpful. This includes attending Commission meetings and events, visits by members of Congress and staff, Federal agency representatives, or staff meetings and briefings.

In addition, the VSA team will cover Florida Congressional delegation meetings, Congressional hearings, meetings, and mark-up sessions when matters of interest to the City are on the agenda. VSA also attends Federal agency meetings and briefings where issues are being discussed that could impact the City. The team provides written summaries of all of these events for the information, and in some cases action, by City leadership and staff.

4. Rio Rancho, New Mexico City of Rio Rancho, NM

In 2007, the City of Rio Rancho entered into a Section 593 Program Agreement with the Corps of Engineers for design and construction assistance of a local water treatment project. Under the agreement, the City would pay for the federal share up-front and 75% of the construction costs (approximately \$6.3 million) would be reimbursed back to the City subject to availability of federal appropriations. Prior to 2014, the Corps had reimbursed the City only one payment for \$350,000 and all other requests had been denied up to that point.

In 2014, the City hired Van Scoyoc Associates. Jim Crum served as the team leader and worked with the City to develop a detailed federal appropriations strategy that would create supportive Congressional policy and support by each stakeholder. These efforts included developing draft Congressional report language to highlight the merits of the project and provide guidance to the Army Corps of Engineers to prioritize reimbursements for project similar to Rio Rancho's. As a result of deploying this strategy and continued advocacy each year, the City received over \$2.1 million in federal reimbursement in 2016 and continued to received reimbursements in each year thereafter until the entire \$6.3 million balance was paid in the fall of 2018.

In 2021, VSA helped Rio Rancho pursue a new authority for water infrastructure and consequently they received an additional \$2.3 million for a water storage project.

The Mayor of Rio Rancho provided the following note to VSA:

"For five years the City of Rio Rancho did not make any significant progress obtaining millions of dollars owed to it by the federal government via a project reimbursement agreement. A consensus was reached by City leadership that a consultant with a proven track record, expertise, and know-how when it comes to navigating the federal process was necessary in order to balance the scales in the City's favor regarding this critical issue. 
