**WHEREAS,** Alzheimer's disease, a progressive neurodegenerative brain disorder, tragically robs individuals of their memories and leads to progressive mental and physical impairments; and

**WHEREAS,** 7.2 million Americans are living with Alzheimer's disease, including an estimated 580,000 individuals in the State of Florida of which an estimated 47,800 reside in Broward County; and

WHEREAS, Alzheimer's is the seventh leading cause of death in America; and

**WHEREAS**, Alzheimer's disease is the only cause of death among the top ten causes of death in America that cannot be prevented, cured, or even slowed; and

**WHEREAS,** in 2025, nearly 12 million caregivers in the United States provided an estimated 18 billion hours of unpaid care, valued at more than 413 billion dollars, and in Florida, over 870,000 caregivers provided over 1.4 billion hours of unpaid care valued at an estimated 29 billion dollars; and

**WHEREAS,** the human cost of Alzheimer's disease is immeasurable and we recognize the individuals, families, friends, and caregivers dealing with Alzheimer's disease, as well as the researchers dedicated to seeking a cause or cure.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the City Commission of the City of Coconut Creek hereby proclaims June 2025, as

## "ALZHEIMER'S AWARENESS MONTH"

in the City of Coconut Creek and recognizes the efforts of the Alzheimer's Association to raise funds and promote awareness to fight Alzheimer's disease and related disorders, thereby improving the quality of human life for those living with Alzheimer's disease and their caregivers.
