# Background



- September 10, 2020 Pass Up Plastic Resolution No. 2020-063 approved by the Commission
  - Encourage City operations and community, including businesses, to participate.
  - All new development asked to participate during DRC review.
  - Campaign web page launched asking the community to pledge to reduce plastic use known as "Pass Up Plastics."
  - Department Staff Assistants instructed on how to participate for all internal functions.
- Fall 2023 Community brings Gainesville Ordinances to the attention of the Commission
- December 7, 2023 Staff addresses concerns with a memo to the City Manager, requesting direction
- February 8, 2024

  Commission meeting discussion asking staff to prepare language for discussion

# Gainesville Ordinance 210129



#### Goals, Pros, & Cons

#### **Division 4 – Single-Use Plastic and Polystyrene Products**

- Prohibition on plastic straws and stirrers:
  - Gainesville most restrictive (paper straw only)
  - Meant to reduce impact of litter
  - A cost reduction to some businesses
- Single-use plastic food accessories available on request:
  - Recommended signage to convey educational message
- Prohibition of expanded polystyrene containers on City Property or City ROW:
  - Costs associated with the implementation of this requirement
- Prohibition of intentional release outdoors of plastic confetti, glitter, and balloons:
  - Existing State Statute that covers the basics
- Enforcement, penalties, injunctive relief:
  - Punitive enforcement

# **Coconut Creek Goals**



#### Single-Use Plastic Ordinance

- Reduce waste entering the landfill by restricting supply of unneeded single-use utensils and condiment packages
- Utensils and straws upon request
- Exempt utensils integral to consuming (soup, ice cream in a bowl, etc.)
- Provide signage notifying customers of the need to request accessories, or self-serve station where the customers take what they need
- Enforcement via sign usage





### **Coconut Creek Goals**



#### Polystyrene

- Re-launch existing City internal checklist
- Reduce use on City property over time using checklist
- Include as policy as part of the "Sustainable Creek" policies underway through Parks and Sustainable Development
- Continue education via "Pass Up Plastics" campaign



# **Coconut Creek Goals**



- Release of plastic balloons, confetti, and glitter
  - Existing State Statute FS 379.233 limits the release of party balloons
  - Include as policy as part of the "Sustainable Creek" policies underway through Parks and Sustainable Development
  - Continue education via "Pass Up Plastics" campaign



# Coconut Creek Cost Considerations



#### Cost

- Small business can save over \$3K per year on plastic accessories
- Many franchisees have transitioned to self-serve areas for accessories



# Coconut Creek Staff Recommendations



#### • Existing Resolution No. 2020-063

- Reduction of expanded polystyrene containers on City Property through checklist
- Discourage the intentional release outdoors of plastic confetti, glitter, and balloons
- Expand education of Resolution and "Pass Up Plastics" campaign

#### New Single-Use Plastic Ordinance

- Definitions
- Plastic straws and stirrers on request
- Single-use plastic food accessories available on request
- City to offer signage graphic for indoor business use; printed signage available for outdoor use
- Enforcement through required signage
- Ban on plastic confetti, glitter, and balloons
