

RESOLUTION NO. 2020-113

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF COCONUT CREEK, FLORIDA, AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER, OR DESIGNEE, TO EXECUTE THE ATTACHED, AND ALL FUTURE AGREEMENTS, BETWEEN THE STATE OF FLORIDA, DIVISION OF EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT (FDEM) AND THE CITY OF COCONUT CREEK FOR REIMBURSEMENT OF EXPENDITURES INCURRED AS A RESULT OF HURRICANE DORIAN; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, August 28, 2019, a City-wide state of emergency was declared as a result of Hurricane Dorian; and

WHEREAS, the City incurred costs associated with protective measures resulting from Hurricane Dorian; and

WHEREAS, the City submitted a Request for Public Assistance (RPA) to the State of Florida, Division of Emergency Management (FDEM), which was subsequently approved; and

WHEREAS, the City requested reimbursement from FDEM for all federal and state eligible costs associated with protective measures resulting from Hurricane Dorian; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the City to enter into the attached, and all future, agreements with the FDEM to receive reimbursement for expenditures related to protective measures incurred as a result of Hurricane Dorian.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF COCONUT CREEK, FLORIDA:

Section 1: That the foregoing "WHEREAS" clauses are hereby ratified and confirmed as being true and correct and are hereby made a specific part of this resolution.

Section 2: That the City Commission has reviewed and hereby approves the agreement between the State of Florida, Division of Emergency Management (FDEM) and the City of Coconut Creek for reimbursement of expenditures incurred as a result of Hurricane Dorian.

Section 3: That the City Manager, or designee, is hereby authorized to execute this agreement, and all future agreements, between the State of Florida, Division of Emergency Management (FDEM) and the City of Coconut Creek for reimbursement of expenditures related to protective measures incurred as a result of Hurricane Dorian.

Section 4: That if any clause, section, other part or application of this resolution is held by any court of competent jurisdiction to be unconstitutional or invalid, in part or in application, it shall not affect the validity of the remaining portion or applications of the resolution.

Section 5: That this resolution shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its adoption.
