RESOLUTION NO. 2018-261

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF COCONUT CREEK, FLORIDA, AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER, OR DESIGNEE, TO EXECUTE THE ATTACHED LAW **ENFORCEMENT** MUTUAL AID AGREEMENT FOR VOLUNTARY COOPERATION AND OPERATIONAL ASSISTANCE AMONG THE CITY OF CREEK AND **BROWARD** LAW COCONUT **ENFORCEMENT** AGENCIES: **PROVIDING FOR** SEVERABILITY; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Florida State Statutes, Chapter 23, Florida Mutual Aid Act, the Coconut Creek Police Department and other agencies have the authority to enter into a voluntary agreement for cooperation and assistance of an urgent and/or routine law enforcement nature that crosses jurisdictional lines; and

WHEREAS, the Coconut Creek Police Department and other member agencies are all participants in a multi-agency effort to provide public safety services; and

WHEREAS, it is to the advantage of the Coconut Creek Police Department to receive and extend mutual aid in the form of law enforcement services with other Broward County Law Enforcement Agencies, in order to respond to continuing, multi-jurisdictional criminal activity; and

WHEREAS, the term of the Law Enforcement Mutual Aid Agreement for Voluntary Cooperation and Operational Assistance is from January 1, 2019, to December 31, 2028.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF COCONUT CREEK, FLORIDA:

<u>Section 1:</u> That the foregoing "WHEREAS" clauses are hereby ratified and confirmed as being true and correct and are hereby made a specific part of this Resolution.

<u>Section 2:</u> That the City Commission hereby approves said Law Enforcement Mutual Aid Agreement for voluntary cooperation and operational assistance among the City of Coconut Creek and Broward County Law Enforcement Agencies.

<u>Section 3:</u> That the City Manager, or designee, is hereby authorized to execute said Law Enforcement Mutual Aid Agreement for voluntary cooperation and operational assistance among the City of Coconut Creek and Broward County Law Enforcement Agencies.

<u>Section 4:</u> That if any clause, section, other part, or application of this Resolution is held by any court of competent jurisdiction to be unconstitutional or invalid, in part or in application, it shall not affect the validity of the remaining portion or applications of this Resolution.

Section 5: That this Resolution shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its adoption.
