CALL TO ORDER

Mayor Tooley called the meeting to order at 7:05 p.m.

Mayor Tooley asked all to rise for the Pledge of Allegiance.

Mayor Tooley explained that Governor Ron DeSantis' Executive Order 20-52, as continuously extended, and Section 252.38, Florida Statutes, authorized all local governments to waive procedures and formalities otherwise required by both state and local law as necessary to allow local governments to continue to perform public work and take whatever prudent action is necessary to ensure the health, safety, and welfare of the community. She noted that the meeting was being conducted live with a quorum physically present consistent with the Governor's Order and State law. City Attorney Pyburn explained the procedures for public participation and comment for the meeting.

Ms. Schmitt briefly addressed the Commission and staff.

CITY MANAGER REPORT

City Manager Brooks reported that a post-legislative workshop was being planned for June 10 at 6 p.m. with the State lobbyist and legislators. She outlined plans for an in-person event planned for Memorial Day at Veterans Park hosted by the American Legion Post 170.

CITY ATTORNEY REPORT

City Attorney Pyburn stated there was one more week left of the legislative session and noted she would send frequent updates. She added that a revised Broward County Emergency Order had been circulated, loosening some of the COVID-19 restrictions.

COMMISSION COMMUNICATIONS

Commissioner Railey had no report.

Commissioner Welch asked how businesses would be updated regarding the new County Emergency Order, and City Manager Brooks commented that the information would be disseminated in the same manner as previous orders. Commissioner Welch attended the Cocomar Water Control District meeting, and asked for staff to follow up on the highlighted issues. She shared her thoughts on the recent Teen Political Forum, commending the students for their professionalism and questions. She stated 200 students participated and thanked staff for their efforts. She explained the Broward League of Cities Scholarship interviews had been held the previous week, and 12 students were ranked for two \$2,500 scholarships. She noted that three of the students from the Teen Political Forum were ranked in the top five.

Commissioner Sarbone echoed Commissioner Welch's comments on the Teen Political Forum, and recognized Commissioner Welch's role in the event. He spoke about the Arbor Day event being held on Saturday and the changes due to COVID-19. He shared his positive personal experience with being vaccinated in hopes of encouraging individuals who have been resistant to getting the COVID-19 vaccine.

Vice Mayor Rydell commented on moving forward with alternate recycling options. He stated he had been lobbying elected officials throughout the County regarding the Solid Waste Working Group and the countywide decisions needing to be made regarding waste. He expressed concern that the effort of that group was being ignored, and shared resistance he had found when engaging leaders of other municipalities. He thanked City Manager Brooks for the work surrounding the Memorial Day event. Vice Mayor Rydell shared his takeaways from a recent meeting he had with the developers of the MainStreet project, noting his concerns surrounding the density of the project. He stated he was troubled with the possibility of losing the developer and ending up with a denser development. Discussion ensued regarding whether the project could be discussed, as it was Quasi-Judicial and had not been included on the noticed agenda. Vice Mayor Rydell asked for consensus to schedule a Workshop to discuss the development, and after discussion, consensus was given to hold a Workshop on the MainStreet design standards. Vice Mayor Rydell wished his daughter, Rachel, a happy ninth birthday.

Mayor Tooley read a letter from resident Joseph Brine regarding outstanding service he had received

from the Coconut Creek staff while doing work on his backyard. She shared her frustration regarding a recent Broward County Commission meeting on the recommendations of the Solid Waste Working Group. Discussion ensued regarding the County's preference for an interlocal agreement in place of an independent district for solid waste as recommended by the Solid Waste Working Group. Mayor Tooley stated she was disappointed but would continue to work in the best interest of the City.
