RESOLUTION NO. 2025-063

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF COCONUT CREEK, FLORIDA, AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR AND THE CITY MANAGER, OR THEIR DESIGNEES, TO EXECUTE A RECIPROCAL USE AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE SCHOOL BOARD OF BROWARD COUNTY AND THE CITY OF COCONUT CREEK PROVIDING FOR RECIPROCAL USE OF CITY FACILITIES AND SCHOOL BOARD FACILITIES FOR A TERM OF FIVE (5) YEARS; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, Florida law provides that municipalities shall have the governmental, corporate, and proprietary powers to enable them to conduct municipal functions, render services, and collaborate with other entities for the benefit of their communities; and

WHEREAS, as part of its recreation program, the City of Coconut Creek desires to provide additional recreation facilities for its residents; and

WHEREAS, the School Board of Broward County, Florida, desires to provide additional recreation facilities for its programming; and

WHEREAS, cities and schools may share resources to support each other's goals and objectives; and

WHEREAS, the City Commission of the City of Coconut Creek deems it to be in the best interest of residents and visitors of the City of Coconut Creek to execute the Reciprocal Use Agreement between the School Board of Broward County, Florida and the City of Coconut Creek to provide for joint use of each other's facilities.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF COCONUT CREEK, FLORIDA:

<u>Section 1:</u> That the foregoing "WHEREAS" clauses are hereby ratified and confirmed as being true and correct and are hereby made a specific part of this resolution. All exhibits attached hereto are incorporated herein and made a specific part of this resolution.

<u>Section 2:</u> That the City Commission has reviewed and hereby approves the Reciprocal Use Agreement, attached hereto as "Exhibit 1," between the School Board of Broward County, Florida, and the City of Coconut Creek to provide for joint use of each other's facilities.

Section 3: That the Mayor and the City Manager, or their designees, are hereby authorized to execute the Reciprocal Use Agreement.

Section 4: That if any clause, section, other part or application of this resolution is held by any court of competent jurisdiction to be unconstitutional or invalid, in part or in application, it shall not affect the validity of the remaining portion or applications of this resolution.

Section 5: That this resolution shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its adoption.
