RESOLUTION NO. 2019-137

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF COCONUT CREEK, FLORIDA, AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER, OR DESIGNEE, TO EXECUTE THE ATTACHED AGREEMENTS BETWEEN THE CITY OF COCONUT CREEK AND DRC EMERGENCY SERVICES, LLC (PRIMARY CONTRACTOR) AND KDF ENTERPRISES, LLC (SECONDARY CONTRACTOR) TO PROVIDE EMERGENCY DEBRIS MANAGEMENT SERVICES PURSUANT TO RFP NO. 03-20-19-10; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the City of Coconut Creek ("City") is located in the State of Florida and as such, could potentially be impacted by natural disasters, including but not limited to, hurricanes, tornados, violent storms, and floods; and

WHEREAS, the impact of a natural disaster on the City could generate large quantities of construction and vegetative debris; and

WHEREAS, in the event of a natural disaster that generates large quantities of debris, the City will need the assistance of a debris management firm to provide for the collection, removal, and disposal of disaster generated debris; and

WHEREAS, the City issued sixty-three (63) electronic invitations through the eBid system on February 24, 2019, and the following ten (10) firms submitted responsive proposals: 1) Bergeron Emergency Services, Inc., 2) Ceres Environmental Services, Inc., 3) Crowder Gulf Joint Venture, Inc., 4) Custom Tree Care, Inc., 5) DRC Emergency Services, LLC, 6) D & J Enterprises, Inc., 7) Grubbs Emergency Services, LLC, 8) KDF Enterprises, LLC, 9) Phillips & Jordan, Inc., and 10) TFR Enterprises, Inc.; and

WHEREAS, a selection committee consisting of Alex Tergis, Assistant Director of Public Works; Brian Rosen, Public Works Project Manager; and Jean Dupuis, Assistant Director of Utilities, evaluated all ten (10) submittals based on the criteria listed in the Request for Proposal (RFP); and

WHEREAS, after an extensive evaluation process, which included the review of each firm's price, operational plan for the City, qualifications and experience, resources and availability, references, and past performance, the selection committee is recommending approval of agreements with DRC Emergency Services, LLC as the primary contractor and KDF Enterprises, LLC as the secondary contractor; and

WHEREAS, the initial contract period shall be for three (3) years, beginning upon the execution date; and

WHEREAS, the City reserves the right to extend the contract for three (3) additional one (1) year periods, providing both parties agree to the extension; all terms, conditions and specifications remain the same; and such extension is approved by the City in writing; and

WHEREAS, the City Commission finds and determines that it is in the best interest of the City to enter into agreements with DRC Emergency Services, Inc. as the primary contractor and KDF Enterprises, LLC as the secondary contractor to provide emergency debris management services to the City in the event of a natural disaster.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF COCONUT CREEK, FLORIDA:

<u>Section 1:</u> That the foregoing "WHEREAS" clauses are hereby ratified and confirmed as being true and correct and are hereby made a specific part of this resolution. All exhibits attached hereto are incorporated herein and made a specific part of this resolution.

<u>Section 2:</u> That the City Commission has reviewed and hereby approves the agreements, attached hereto and made a part hereof, between the City of Coconut Creek and DRC Emergency Services, LLC as the primary contractor and KDF Enterprises, LLC as the secondary contractor to provide emergency debris management services pursuant to RFP No. 03-20-19-10.

<u>Section 3:</u> That the City Manager, or designee, is hereby authorized to execute the aforementioned agreements between the City of Coconut Creek and DRC Emergency Services, LLC as the primary contractor and KDF Enterprises, LLC as the secondary contractor to provide for emergency debris management services.

<u>Section 4:</u> That if any clause, section, other part or application of this resolution is held by any court of competent jurisdiction to be unconstitutional or invalid, in part or in application, it shall not affect the validity of the remaining portion or applications of this resolution.

Section 5: That this resolution shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its adoption.
