CALL TO ORDER

Mayor Belvedere called the meeting to order at 6:59 p.m. and led the Pledge of Allegiance.

3. 16-72 A PROCLAMATION DESIGNATING THE CITY AS A PURPLE HEART CITY.

Commissioner Tooley read the Proclamation into the record and recognized Coconut Creek Police Service Aide Scott Hysell as a Purple Heart recipient. Donald Mates accepted the Proclamation on behalf of the Military Order of the Purple Heart, and Don Schwiesow accepted a second Proclamation on behalf of the American Legion Post 170. Mr. Mates provided a brief overview of the services provided by

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the Military Order of the Purple Heart and presented the City with two reserved parking signs for combat-wounded veterans. American Legion Post 170 District Commander Don Schwiesow presented the City with the Purple Heart Flag. Mayor Belvedere recognized Purple Heart recipients John Dugan, Joseph Aiello, Scott Hysell, and Abe Marcus.

4. 16-73 A PROCLAMATION RECOGNIZING JUNE 20, 2016, AS "WORLD REFUGEE DAY."

Commissioner Welch read the Proclamation into the record. Mayor Belvedere accepted the Proclamation.

5. 16-76 A PRESENTATION OF AERIAL UTILITIES UNDERGROUNDING INFORMATION.

Utilities and Engineering Director Osama Elshami presented this item and provided an overview of completed and proposed undergrounding projects in the City. He discussed the reasons for undergrounding and the challenges.

Acting City Manager Karen Brooks had no report.

CITY ATTORNEY REPORT

City Attorney Terrill Pyburn had no report.

COMMISSION COMMUNICATIONS

Commissioner Tooley attended a tribute to veterans at Coconut Creek Elementary on May 26. She attended the County Commission Meeting on May 24, 2016. She noted that County Commissioner Mark Bogen voted for the transportation surtax at a recent Broward County Commission Meeting.

Commissioner Welch attended the Atlantic Technical College and High School Advisory Council Meeting and noted there was discussion regarding using Title I funds to staff each Broward County School with a nurse. She attended the Tradewinds Elementary School 20th Anniversary Celebration. She noted that the Silverspot Movie Theater celebrated its one year anniversary on May 25, 2016, and pointed out that this would initiate the traffic light study for the intersection at Cullum Road and Lyons Road. Commissioner Welch announced that she will begin reviewing Commission agendas electronically, instead of receiving a paper copy.

Commissioner Sarbone noted that he hoped the County Commission and municipalities could have discussions regarding the one cent surtax options before the County Commission's final action. He stated his disappointment with the County Commission regarding the Resource Recovery Board Settlement.

Vice Mayor Rydell proposed implementing a "time certain" for regular business on the Commission agendas and invited the Commissioners to comment on the idea. City Attorney Pyburn noted that it is at

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the Commission's discretion to set the procedures and consensus would be needed to implement any procedural changes. Discussion ensued regarding implementing a "time certain" on agenda items. Upon a motion by Commissioner Tooley, seconded by Vice Mayor Rydell, consensus was given to implement a "time certain" to begin hearing the items on the regular agenda at 7:30 p.m., with everything through the Consent Agenda to be heard prior. The motion was approved by a unanimous voice vote to begin this at the next Commission Meeting.

Mayor Belvedere discussed the one cent surtax options proposed to the municipalities by Broward County. She noted that the Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) worked with students from Deerfield Beach High School to teach them about transportation planning, and she was a judge for the student's final planning exercise that was held at the MPO Meeting on May 17, 2016. She attended the annual Greater Fort Lauderdale Realtors Mayors' Breakfast in Plantation and recognized Deputy Director of Sustainable Development Scott Stoudenmire for his attendance there.
