1. ORD 2016-42

AN ORDINANCE ADOPTING THE CITY'S OPERATING PROPERTY

TAX AT 6.1370 MILLS FOR THE 2017 FISCAL YEAR. (SECOND

READING/PUBLIC HEARING)

City Attorney Pyburn read the Ordinance title into the record.

MOTION: Welch/Tooley – To approve Ordinance No. 2016-42.

Mayor Belvedere presented the item and introduced Director of Finance Karen Brooks. Ms. Brooks gave a brief summary of the Property Tax Rate Ordinance and the 2017 Fiscal Year Budget Ordinance and stated that the first public hearing was held on September 14, 2016. She noted that as per Florida Statues, every taxing authority is required to publish an advertisement, which states the date and time for the second public hearing on the property tax rate and budget, and publish a budget summary adjacent to the notice of property tax increase. The City complied with the law by running an ad in the September 19, 2016 edition of the *Sun Sentinel*.

Mayor Belvedere opened the public hearing. There were no questions or comments from the public, and the public hearing was closed.

Upon roll call, the Ordinance was passed by a 5-0 vote.

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2. ORD 2016-41

AN ORDINANCE ADOPTING THE FISCAL YEAR 2017 OPERATING AND CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT BUDGET AS THE CITY'S OFFICIAL BUDGET. THIS ORDINANCE WILL APPROPRIATE FUNDS FOR OPERATING CITY DEPARTMENTS AND CAPITAL PROJECTS FROM OCTOBER 1, 2016 TO SEPTEMBER 30, 2017. (SECOND READING/PUBLIC HEARING)

MOTION: Tooley/Rydell – To approve Ordinance No. 2016-41.

City Attorney Pyburn read the Ordinance title into the record.
