PRESENTATIONS

Agenda Item 2 was presented first on the Agenda.

1. 17-064 STUDENT ARTWORK RECOGNITION.

Recreation Programmer Josh Salter introduced staff members from Winston Park Elementary School, Tradewinds Elementary School, and North Broward Preparatory Lower School. Certificates were presented individually to the students participating in the Student Artwork Display at City Hall.

A PRESENTATION CELEBRATING COCONUT CREEK'S 40TH ANNIVERSARY OF RECOGNITION BY THE INTERNATIONAL CITY/COUNTY MANAGEMENT ASSOCIATION (ICMA) FOR OPERATING UNDER THE COMMISSION-MANAGER FORM OF GOVERNMENT.

Michael Cernech, City of Tamarac City Manager and President-Elect of the Florida City and County Management Association (FCCMA), congratulated the City for its excellence in government administration and presented the City with a Certificate of Recognition for its long-standing commitment to the Commission-Manager form of government.

3. 17-100 A SWEARING-IN CEREMONY FOR NEW POLICE OFFICER WILLIAM BUSTAMANTE.

Police Chief Albert "Butch" Arenal welcomed new Police Officer Bustamante. He introduced Officer Bustamante and asked him and his family to come forward for the swearing-in. The Oath of Office was administered by City Clerk May followed by the badge pinning.

Mayor Tooley implemented the Time-Certain at 7:45 p.m. The Input from Residents of Coconut Creek, City Manager Report, City Attorney Report, and Commission Communications were heard after the Consent and Regular Agenda.

INPUT FROM RESIDENTS OF COCONUT CREEK

Beth Gastineau, 2170 NW 40 Terrace, Coconut Creek, thanked Police Sergeant Slavin and Police Sergeant Karp for their help addressing traffic issues in the Township Estates neighborhood. She requested that permanent solar speed signs be installed to continue improving the traffic issues.

CITY MANAGER REPORT

City Manager Blasi announced that the Budget Town Hall Meeting to obtain resident input on the Fiscal Year 2018 budget would be held at 6 p.m. on June 13, 2017. She reported that the City of Coconut Creek was a finalist in the Greater Fort Lauderdale Alliance Economic Development Partner of the Year Award and distributed a handout highlighting the recognition. She recognized GIS Coordinator Ken Brown for his assistance developing a map of all the residential communities in the City and distributed the map to the Commission.

CITY ATTORNEY REPORT

City Attorney Pyburn had no report.

COMMISSION COMMUNICATIONS

Commissioner Belvedere attended a conference regarding the opioid epidemic and was pleased that the Police Department was informed on the issues.

Commissioner Welch noted that the Broward County School Board approved the use of a new educational video on the dangers of opioid use for middle and high school students, but the principals of each school would decide if it is used in each of their respective schools. She attended the Greater Fort Lauderdale Realtors' Mayors Breakfast and Municipal Expo. She recognized Sustainable Development Deputy Director Scott Stoudenmire for representing the City at the Municipal Expo and shared many of the City's recent accomplishments during the panel discussions at the event. She asked staff to provide an update on the Cullum and Lyons Road traffic signal study to share with the Coquina community. She commended the Police Department for their public service announcement at the *Silverspot Cinema*.

Commissioner Sarbone spoke about the Memorial Day Ceremony at Veteran's Park on May 29. He commended the Commission for working well together to serve the needs of the community and was pleased to serve with each of them.

Vice Mayor Rydell echoed Commissioner Sarbone's sentiments and thanked the Commission for their efforts. He attended the *National Kids to Parks Day* hosted by the Parks and Recreation Department at Lakeside Park and was surprised that more residents did not attend the event. He announced that the Broward County Commission ratified his application to serve on the County's Substance Abuse Advisory Board.

Mayor Tooley commented that the *National Kids to Parks Day* was a great event and suggested the location of this year's event may have been the reason the attendance was not as high as usual. She spoke about the opening of Fire Station 50.

City Clerk May confirmed that the advertising and public notice requirements were met for Agenda Items 9 and 10 and swore in the witnesses. She instructed the speakers, when they come forward to speak, to state their name and address clearly for the record and whether or not they were sworn-in and understand the rules of the proceedings.

Mayor Tooley noted that Agenda Items 9 and 10 were companion items that could be presented together. There were no objections from the Commission, City staff, or the Applicant to hear the items together, and City Attorney Pyburn read the Ordinance title for Agenda Item 10 into the record.

City Attorney Pyburn asked if there were any disclosures or ex parte communications on the Agenda Items, and there were none.

Sustainable Development Director Sheila Rose presented the item and gave an overview of the proposed expansion of the Infiniti car dealership. She introduced the Applicant, Jay Huebner of HSQ Group, Inc., to answer technical questions.

AN ORDINANCE EXTENDING THE FRANCHISE AGREEMENT WITH REPUBLIC SERVICES OF FLORIDA, L.P., D/B/A ALL SERVICE REFUSE, DATED SEPTEMBER 22, 2011, FOR AN ADDITIONAL TWO (2) YEAR PERIOD UNDER THE SAME TERMS AND CONDITIONS CURRENTLY IN EFFECT IN ORDER TO PROVIDE FOR CONTINUED SOLID WASTE DISPOSAL AND RECYCLING SERVICE WITHIN THE CITY OF COCONUT CREEK. (FIRST READING)

City Attorney Pyburn read the Ordinance title into the record.

Sarbone/Rydell – To adopt Ordinance No. 2017-022.

Public Works Director Jim Berkman presented the item. Discussion ensued regarding the solid waste collection services, and Public Works Operations Manager Michael Heimbach responded. Discussion ensued regarding having Republic Services ensure that dumpsters are deodorized and that they provide contact information for residents to report issues. Republic Services responded to the requests, and it was noted that the contact information for Republic Services would be placed on the City's website. Discussion ensued regarding trash bins being properly set back down after they were emptied.

Upon roll call, the Ordinance passed by a 5-0 vote.

15. ORD 2017-021

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE CITY'S CODE OF ORDINANCES BY AMENDING CHAPTER 5, ENTITLED "ANIMALS," TO PROHIBIT THE RELEASE OF WILD ANIMALS ON CITY PROPERTY, PROVIDING PENALITIES FOR VIOLATION, AND UPDATING TERMINOLOGY. (SECOND READING)(PUBLIC HEARING)

City Attorney Pyburn read the Ordinance title into the record.

Welch/Belvedere - To adopt Ordinance No. 2017-021.

City Attorney Pyburn noted that Section 5-8(c) was updated after first reading of the Ordinance to reflect that the violation is \$500 per animal, per violation.

Upon roll call, the Ordinance passed by a 5-0 vote.
