"AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF BROWARD COUNTY, FLORIDA, PERTAINING TO PUBLIC CAMPING OR SLEEPING; CREATING SECTIONS 21-2 AND 21-3 OF THE BROWARD COUNTY CODE OF ORDINANCES ("CODE"); AMENDING SECTION 21-6 OF THE CODE; AND PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY, INCLUSION IN THE CODE, AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE. (Sponsored by the Board of County Commissioners)" • Commission will be holding a Homelessness Workshop immediately following the Regular County Commission Meeting on October 22, 2024

Dania Beach	<p style="text-align: center;">No formal mention of HB 1365 as of yet .</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • BUT September 24th Commission meeting included Dania Beach Monthly Memo to City Manager where they do mention a Homeless Outreach Team. • Homeless Outreach deputies coordinated with Dania Beach Code Enforcement and the property owner for the AT&T easement (4400 Griffin Rd), to clear out existing debris, secure the site, and prevent future encampments from being built. • Ongoing patrols continue along SW 4 Ave, along the FEC railroad tracks, all city parks, and City Hall. • The surveillance tower is currently at Chester Byrd Park reference complaints of vandalism and narcotics activity.

<p style="text-align: center;">West Park</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • City of West Park is in the "Fact Finding Process" and are looking to implement the Homeless Management Information System in order to collect data because they are looking at trying to suggest an amendment to the statute that would allow for State/Federal funding. • City Commission held meeting September 4th and had Agenda Item #: 15-1 regarding HB 1365 where they shared that a City Manager meeting was held in Broward County and determined that their first step was to implement the Homeless Management Information System (HMIS) (database that tracks homelessness countywide; identifies the category of needs/conditions, and addresses how to properly assist unsheltered residents) as an initial "risk-management effort". • They also created an agreement between Broward County and "A Covered Homeless Organization" (CHO) (organization (including its employees, volunteers, affiliates, contractors, and associates) that records, uses, or processes data on clients experiencing homelessness for an HMIS) for training users on how use the HMIS program. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Maritza Prebal, Superintendent of Administrative Services is the contact person regarding HMIS and will be trained to use it. • This was brought up at a City Commission Meeting (September 4th, 2024) the City Manager W. Ajibola Balogun said 49 minutes into the meeting, "We cannot make prison or arrests be a solution for unsheltered residents if not for the grace of God we would be in that position. So we will not do that."
